Directions to Barrington, RI High School

From North and West:

Route 95 to Route 195 East toward Cape Cod
Exit off 195 to 114 South to Barrington/Warren
Eight miles south, 114 at stop light intersection
(white church, bridge on left, playing field on right)
Turn right on Federal Road, then left on Upland Way
to the High School parking lot.

From South and East:

West on 103 or North on 114 to Barrington Center
Go through Center, North to Lincoln Ave
Left on Lincoln Ave to High School parking lot.
Watch for "Fish Show" signs at intersections near
the High School area.

Note new format for 2011 show!

11:AM -- doors open for shoppers;

1:00 PM -- Show starts

2:00 to 2:30 -- Giant raffle of 100+ prizes.

(New format ideas came from regular visitors)

How the Expo day is organized:

10:00 AM - Exhibitors set up offerings in the cafeteria.

11:00 AM - Doors open for the public to shop the Expo, buy raffle tickets or refreshments and schmooze with pals.

1:00 PM - Show starts right on time in the auditorium

2:00 PM to 2:45 - Giant raffle; door prizes drawn; buy food,

2:45 to 3:45 - Second speaker presents his show

3:45 on: Expo remains open for interested shoppers

The cafeteria Expo Flea Market bargain center opens at 10:00 AM for exhibitors to set up, and at 11:00 AM for shoppers. East Bay Anglers' charities support youth-oriented activities.

The East Bay Anglers originated fishermen's Winter seminars 26 years ago to fund charitable activities which currently include:

RISAA Take a Kid Fishing: In the beginning we took groups of young boys from local group homes out to fish on Galilee 'head' boats. When these catches declined we switched to day-long picnics on member's boats. Later we merged those activities into RISAA's annual "Take-A-Kid Fishing Day" for which we are now a major funder. This year we were part of an 84-boat event for 300 kids!

Barrington High School: The High School benefits from three areas that produce nearly \$1500 dollars. Half comes from profits of the food concession in the cafeteria--often used for special events or trips; another income source is the facility usage fees with total nearly \$500. Another key donation of \$500 is made for college-bound student scholarship. The 2010 recipient Hugh Neville plans a career in environmental law. He will attend St. Lawrence U in Canton, N.Y. (See photo at right.)

Save the Bay: We give hundreds to this key conservation group which seeks to improve Narragansett Bay.

On The Water Magazine: We help this magazine support an activity for struggling teenage boys which takes place on Penikese Island (just north of Cuttyhunk).

American Littoral Society: We also support groups that improve the environment from which we enjoy our hobby. Other requests for help come to the club during the year to which we respond.
